I understand that strictly speaking the First XV won last week's match against Black Forest on forfeit; however a match was played against a Black Forest - Gawler team which Collegians won 58 - 0.

The score tells pretty well the whole story of the game and further comment is of little value. Suffice to say that the team handled a wet ball remarkably well; surprising even themselves with good passing rushes incorporating remarkably clean handling. The backline relished being given the opportunity to show their paces and justified the faith shown them in this particular game and personally I was very pleased to see it. Our winners scored over half the total number of tries and all but three were scored by our backs. Among the best players were: Jackson, Schwartzter, Graham, Forbes, Manson, Burgess, Guerin and Bainbridge. The scorers were: Jackson (5) Graham (4) Schwartzter, Manson, Moulinie, Bainbridge, Desfontaines, Guerin and Wilby. Forbes kicked three conversions.

AN OLD COLLEGIANS XV. 3: WOODVILLE 11. 8.

Saturday broke records: It was among the foulest of many foul Saturdays this season and not one of our four sides played a proper match against nominated opposition. All in all a splendid preparation for the exacting knock-out rounds 2,3 and we hope 4 weeks ahead.

Still we have got all four teams into "the four" which is quite an achievement and some of them should still be interested on the 26th September.

A blending of our 11 and 111 sides played a friendly game against Woodville 11, but the weather conditions were too much for both sides and the play was seldom interesting enough to compensate for the dreadful weather, frozen feet and a soggy scribbling pad. Add to this three hurried flights to the cover of the pavilion and you are not going to get much of a report.

Woodville attacked first and were stopped only by a fine tackle by Toby McCarthy. Collegians rushed play to the other end and recorded a remarkable try. From a scrum 25 yards out right in front of the posts we got a quick clean heel and with Woodville concentrated to stop a direct assault, Merrick Goodwin put in a hefty kick towards the left corner flag. I do not know whether his intention was touch near the flag or to put the ball over the line in an undefended area, but the fact is that the ball crossed the line a couple of feet in play and the kicker got to it before the bewildered defence woke up. The difficult conversion kick was missed, which was not surprising. (3-0).

As Woodville set up a vigorous attack so did the rain and much of the game was viewed from a great distance. The only notable events before half-time were a long dribble by Brian Sweeting and some excellent full-back play by Poleska.

Woodville opened the second half with a good converted try, capping an attack started on their own 25, which was aided by some pretty half-hearted tackling (3-5). Just before the end they clinched the matter with a rather untidy try forward. (3-8).

Our best players in a game which was unlikely to benefit many reputations were:- Ric. Dutton, Backler, B. Sweeting, Poleska, Goodwin, and McCarthy.
