WORLD CUP TICKETS

The computer ballot to determine which 7,118 applicants get tickets to the prime RWC games was drawn on 11 February 2003. Approximately 65,000 pool game ticket holders were in two ballots - one for the public and one for the rugby community. In theory, members of the Australian "rugby community" had a much better chance of securing tickets. With approximately 23,000 in the rugby community competing for half of the 124,000 prime match tickets, we had a significantly greater chance than the 42,000 contenders in the public ballot. Every pool ticket represented a chance in the ballot. The result of the ballot will be posted within two weeks on the rugby2003.com.au website and in the mail. Those successful have 28 days to purchase their allocated tickets.

Those unlucky in the ballot will have another chance to win any tickets not taken up when a second ballot is held in April-May. There were 30,000 people who completely missed out on tickets in the initial offer and they, along with others who missed out on their specified pool games, will soon be offered extra tickets handed back to organisers by the IRB and membership groups. On July 1 any tickets left over - pool or prime - will go on general sale.



The Club's on-line Super 12's footy tipping competition will be underway as soon as the Footy-tips website is ready.

RUGBY SEASON 2003



ELIZABETH SEVENS - Saturday, 1 March 2003

Old Collegians has entered a men's team and a women's team in this year's sevens tournament at Elizabeth. Get out to training if you intend to be part of either of them.

As the 2003 season approaches, the details are being ironed out. SARU is reviewing the competition rules, such as the criteria for the West End Cup, and eligibility of players. The first game of the season will be on Saturday 5th April and the last on 30th August 2003. SARU is contemplating having only the top four teams in the finals. However, the ordinary club competition will continue throughout the Nationals. The plan for the season is that the 1s and 2s, 3s and women play on the same pitch as much as possible. The draw for the 3s, 4s or women is not yet available as it is hoped that more numbers will be found yet. The current draw is probably not the final version. Our first game in the first version of the draw was Brighton again. We are told that the draw was completely random, which raised the question how it always ends up the same? In any event, after some gentle prodding the draw was rejigged. However, under the next version of the draw there were five "away games" in a row and five "home games" in a row later in the year. SO it has been reversed to the original version. Stay tuned.

The women's competition will have somewhere between three and six teams this year. Burnside has folded but Old Colls, Uni and Southern Suburbs remain strong. In addition, Port Adelaide Woodville and Brighton are rumoured to be trying to get teams together. A State women's team is hoped to be re-established this year. SARU's Matt Nicholls (also Coach of the Uni girls) has been appointed Coach of the State Women's Team.

PROTECTIVE GEAR FOR 2003 SEASON




